"An example may make this clearer: Board "X" is a seven-member board. A statute provides that four members constitute a quorum. The statute does not specify the number of votes required for action. Therefore, at least three concurring votes are needed (majority of the four required for a quorum) to take action."

"At a meeting, six of the seven members are present. On a motion, three vote in favor, two vote against, and one abstains. The chairman would correctly declare that the motion passed: the motion only needed three votes in favor, and the abstention counted neither as a vote in favor or as a vote against."
